Chairman, Scott Cullen, called the meeting to order.

Ed Irish made a motion to accept expenditures and Gilbert Voelker seconded.

Carol Poehnlein gave the Treasurer's report.

Clerk, Penny Gehrke gave a report regarding her upcoming vacation. She also discussed advertising the board meeting in the Shopper, where no decisions were made. She also discussed our township insurance policy and will be checking into other insurance companies. It was also discussed that she does not work on the weekends unless absolutely needed.

Crimestoppers meeting on the 24th of September. They will be holding a fund-raising golf outing.
